Antique Parrefeuille Terracotta- Parrefeuille tiles were used throughout the southern part of France, and are unusual by their rectangular shape rather than square shape. These tiles are hand selected by Paris Ceramics from the Languedoc region of France. Antique Parrefeuille tiles were handmade and fired in wood-burning kilns, a practice that ceased in the 19th century. Made from local earth, roughly sieved, to give them their varied texture and beautiful pink and ochre tones, these tiles are up to 150 years in age. They are still relatively plentiful, allowing a genuine period character to be introduced into almost any room at a very reasonable cost.

Antique Parrefeuille tiles are approximately 8" x 14" x 1" to 1¼" in thickness. They vary in size and color depending on the "hand maker" and the temperature of the wood burning ovens. Antique Parrefeuille is used primarily indoors. It can be used outside in non-freeze areas only.
